Alliander Whistleblower Scheme

What is the Whistleblower Scheme?

The Whistleblower Scheme is a procedure that you can use to report – within the company – any serious irregularities you observe relating to Alliander, its subsidiaries in the Netherlands and parties such as suppliers and authorities in a broad sense. Under the scheme you can also report such irregularities to an external party. This procedure applies to Alliander and its subsidiaries in the Netherlands.

How does the Whistleblower Scheme work?

If you have observed or suspect fraud, deception or another irregularity, you can report this to:
